Sir, I BELIEVE I oughit to oommu. nicate to you the copy of a letter which I have juit written to the Attorney General of the United States, to demand of himg that Meffrs. Jay and King, the one ehief Juftice, and the other a Senator of the U. States, who have publifhed in the he w! papers a libel who have publifhed in the hew! papers a hibel
againtt me, fhould be profeçuted at the Federal Court. 1 have to this magyent omitted nothing to afcertain the fallity of the perfidious itppoflure to which thefe Gentlemen have not been afhamed to add their names. It is with this view I ventured to write to the Prefident of the U. Stares-it is with this view that my triends have called, in many papers upon Mr. Jay and Mr. King to produce the proofs of their affertion; but the anfwer which you were charged to make me, Sir, being as indecifive as the filence of thole gentlemen was profound, a judicial enquey only remains for me to confound thofe who have traduced me, both as delegate of the French people, and as an individual. This fatisfaction will be the moft agreeable I could obtain, for I have only wighed for the efteem of a free and virtuous people, of whatioever country they might be ; it is doubtlefs grievous to fee at this day calumnty bent upon purfuing the, and the benevolence of a people whom 1 revere, furprifed from me, as well as that of their firft toagiftrate. Bat what will be my fatisfaction when truth alone fhall force thofe who now nifconflue both my intentions and my principles, to do juftice to my courage, my unhuken patriotilin, and the purity of my conduct. Sir,
hitherto proRE prefing avocation's have the fubject of a publie infult to my nation and to myfelf, which I underfand from Gen* tlenten of the law here you are the perfon officially to be made acquainted with. I enclofe you, fir, a new fpaper printed in NewLe York, in which the Chief Jultice of the U. nited States, Mr. Jay, and a Senator of the United States, Mr. King, have certified to the public, as a teclaration of thine, what is utterly and totaly falle - To you fir, who are doubrlefs acquainted with the contemptable arts prattifed by parties to hurt the characters fuppofed to obftruct heir views. it is neealefs to errlarge upon the in. jury this certificate has donethe casfe of my country in the opinion of this; or the perfonal dilemma inte which-it has, as was intended, plunged my felf. sthe lie having efiected jits purpofe; I can unfortumately for jultice but ioo flowly follow it with detection. It is, however, a daty T owe my own cfficial character, to procurea, public profecution of a calumny, which pothing but their punlice fituations whe: are the authors of it, induces me to shink more of than of the reft of the low newfpaper abufe to which I have been fo much accultomed.

As you are, as Iam informed, from your official fituation, the profecutor of outrages commitred by citizens of the. United States, either'againt foreign mations or their reprefentatives to the $1 / \mathrm{mimed}$ Siates, 1 am fatiofied that it is fuffictar for me to aequaint you of the fcandalous fallity, of the charge made againft me, to induce you to take fuch fteps, at the entuing Federal Court, as the honor
of your own country, as well as of minte, exet upon fuch an occifient-r thall atiend you for this purpole at any time and place you point qut, and defire tit be favored with your anlwer, when and where that mult be.
