OFFICIAL COMMUNICATIONS. Copy of a Letter from Mr. Genet, Minister Pienipotentiary from the Republic of France, to Mr. Jeffer on, Secretary of State. News York, November 14, 1703. Second Year of the French Republic.

I BELIEVE I ought to communicate to you the copy of a letter which I have just written to the Attorney General of the United States, to demand of him, that Meffrs. Jay and King, the one shief fullice, and the other a Senator of the U. States. who have published in the newspapers a libel against me, should be projecuted at the Federal Court. I have to this moment omitted nothing to afcertain the fallity of the perfidious imposture to which these Gentlemen have not been ashamed to add their names. It is with this view I ventured to write to the President of the U. States-it is with this view that my triends have called, in many papers upon Mr. Jay and Mr. King to produce the proofs of their affertion; but the answer which you were charged to make me, Sir, being as indecifive as the filence of thole gentlemen was profound, a judicial enqury only remains for me to confound those who have traduced me, both as delegate of the French people, and as an individual. This fatisfaction will be the most agreeable I could obtain, for I have only wished for the efteem of a free and virtuous people, of whattoever country they might be; it is doubtless grievous to see at this day calumny bent upon purluing me, and the benevolence of a people whom I revere, furpriled from me, as well as that of their first magistrate. But what will be my fatisfaction when truth alone shall force those who now misconstrue both my intentions and my principles, to do justice to my courage, my unflaken patriotion, and the purity of my conduct. Accept, FORD. my respects.

New-York, November 14, 1703. Second Year of the French Republica

MORE prefling avocations have hitherto prevented my applying to you, on day, at the ball room of the old Palace bethe subject of a public infult to my nation ing an exhibition that surprizes the spectaand to myfelf, which I understand from Gentlemen of the law here you are the person officially to be made acquainted with. I enclose you, fir, a newspaper printed in New-York, in which the Chief Justice of the U. nited States, Mr. Jay, and a Senator of the United States, Mr. King, have certified to the public, as a declaration of mine, what is utterly and totaly falle. To you fir, who are doubtless acquainted with the contemptable arts practifed by parties to hurt the characters supposed to obstruct their views, it is needless to emarge upon the injury this certificate has done the cause of my country in the opinion of this; or the perfonal dilemma into which it has, as was intended, plunged my felf. The lie having effected its purpose, I can unfortunately for jultice but 100 flowly follow it with detection. It is, however, a daty I owe my own efficial character, to procure a public profecution of a calumny, which nothing but their punlic fituations who are the authors of it, induces me to think more of than of the reft of the low newspaper abuse to which I have been fo much accultomed.

As you are, as I am informed, from your official lituation, the profecutor of dutrages committed by citizens of the United States, either against foreign nations or their reprefentatives to the United States, I am fatisfied that it is fushcient for me to acquaint you of the fcandalous fallity of the charge made against me, to induce you to take such steps, at the entuing Federal Court, as the honor

of your own country, as well as of mine, exect upon fuch an occasion - I shall attend you for this purpole at any time and place you point out, and defire to be favored with your aniwer, when and where that mult

The last intelligence from France advise. that the whole Republic was in a state of the most active warlike movements and preparations-all the male citizens, from 16 to 45 years of age, being required to hear arms, and to hold themselves in constant readiness to march.-All stores, provisions, &c. were held at the service of the public, the owners to receive such compensation therefor, as may be awarded by referrees. That all the artizans in metal and wood, were employed in manufacture of wood and warlike implements. In the manufactory at Paris, 25,000 mulquets, and 30 pieces of cannon, were mauufactured every month; and the ufeless bells in the churches melted down to supply the forges !
