ORD Hood, in his first proclamation to the Toulonese, made no mention of the Conflictation of 1729, wishing no doubt to avoid representing the British Winistry as inconfiftent with themselves, and to cirect contradiction to the views of their Allies. The caution, however, foon fortook him-In his fecond proclamation he declares for the restoration of the Conflitution of 1789, and announces that the proclamation had produced a very happy effect-that is to lay, is quieted the fcruples of fuch of the inhabitants of Toulon as could not agree to betray their country, but who, provided France was in lever dent and free, were indifferent as to the term of its government.
