THE publication of a Revision of the public laws of this State, by Judge Iredell, having seemingly superseded the necessity of preserving the pamphlets published at the rise of each session of the Legislature, these are now looked upon as useless lumber, and in a few years will probably cease to be extant. In them alone (if the records of the Secretary's Office are excepted) that are contained a number of Acts, which tho' called private, are of momentous utility to many of the inhabitants of this State, and may eventually become so to all of them. They were not included in the Judge's revision, and the difficulty of finding a number of them is already extreme, and without a republication, will soon ripen into an absolute impracticability.

Under these impressions, F. X. Martin has undertaken to collect and reprint them and will furnish a well bound copy of his collection to any gentleman who may wish to honor the undertaking with his patronage.
