NEW-YORK, February 8.

Copy of a letter from a respectable house in Lifbon, to a mercantile gentleman in Veu-Yorks " Lifton, 22d November, 1793.

TE confirm what we had the pleasure of writing you by the last conveyance, and the present serves to advise you of the information we fince received down to this day's post, regarding the Alge. rines, and the continuance of American arrivals here and at Cadiz. William Short, Elq : your ministeriat the court of Madrid, writes us from St. Laurence. 14th instant, that there was certain intelligence of two American vellels carried into Algiers; that one of them was loaded for Spanish account, but does not mention the names of the veilels. Mr. James Simp. fon, American agent at Gibraltar, writes, under the 7th, the following - No American veffels hive been brought in here, nor have the Portuguele veffets cruifed fince the 6th of last month, to know what prizes' may have been carried up; befides the two frigates' mentioned to have returned to Algiers, a third paffed upon Friday halt ; fo that, at prefent, only one cruifer of the regency remains to the westward, and one or two zebecs at most, with a small cruifer of four guns and fifty men."

Meffrs, Lurnbull and Co. of Gibraltar. under the fame date, 7th instant, fay- We only understand here that the Algerines have captured feven veffels, but there is no getting at the truth at prefent, as they fend them forward to Algiers, where we have wrote for information; it is not known here when they pass the Straits."

" From the tenor of there advices you may judge of the little dependence as yetof what American veffels have been captured, and from the contemptible force of the corfairs, how eafy it is to check and put a flop to the mischief they premeditate; for a couple of frigates could block them up in their
