## G ENOA, Novémber 4.

OUR Republic is in a more critical ftate (han it has been in for half a centurv. The commanders of the Britifh and Spanilh quadrons in our port, which were reenforced laft week by feveral fhips of the line, frigates, and cutters, perfift in urging the Senate, even by threats, to join the powers combined againft France ; there is, howe ver, at Genoa, a very numerous party which oppofes this coalition, and is even in favour of the Convention. Thof who beiong to this party are accufed of the moft finifter defigns; and the Government has ordered public prayers for three days; which ended on Wednefday laft, to preferve the State from the dangers which threatened it.
This relates to the dircovery of a Cataline confpiracy, encompaffed by a fet of men, wao, favoured by feditious anarchy, flattered themfelves to turn the general coufulion to their own profit. One of thofe conon the the own pronit. One of thofe con-
fpirators has been arrefied at Pozzuolo, amirators has bean arretied at Poz zuoo, aof all the accomplices in this confpiracy, or thofe at leaft who were to have a flare in it and whofe number exceeds 3000 . The faid papers alfo contain their defrans, and he expences which they hitd atredf incurred, or were farther to incur, to obtain adherents and abettors.
The chief ef the confpiracy is alfo faid to be in cuftody; he is a Roman by birth, of the name of Poli, and was in the fervice of Nir. Tilly, the refident Minifter of the Convention. It is alfo faid, that in the note feized upon this chief, there are the names of 14 young patricians, who have already left Genoa.
The plan of the confipirators was to fet fire to Porto Franco, and to the hofpital of the poor; ;and while every body would be bufy in extinguifling the flames, 600 of the confpirators were to go to the Bank of St. George, to pinnder the treafure; 300 more were to make themfelves mafters of the fort and of the battery of St . Benigno, 250 of the battery of Della Cava; $25^{\circ}$ of the battery called La Stria; and 200 of the arfenal and the Palace: The reft of the confpirators were to patrol the city, to plunder, and to fpread confernation. We will not vouch for the truth of thefe reports.
Nov: 9. Cur Senate feems to wifh to preferte the neutrality. Forefeeing that this barbour and the ollier ports of Genoa weht blockaded, the Council has taken the greateft precautions. At the fame time all the Gcnoefe merchantmen are forbidden to leave pori.

The French are fill in our territory, but at nighte they fleep on board their fhips. Citizen Tilly, the French Miniter, fill re-. mains here.
L.EGHORN, November 6 .

We learn from Corfica, that the Royalift party, with General Paoli at their head, gain ground on the conientional party (which is the leaft numerous) in that lifand, daily. The latter, after various defeats, have loft feveral towns and a number of important jofts. A commidioner from the Convention, and fome other republicans, liave been taken by the Englifhliees, in the Gciph of St. Laurence, and fent to Corto.
