NEW BERN, OCTOBER 3.

Extract of a letter from Wilmington, dated September 26th, 1796.

Every moment of my time, for some days past, has been employed in the melancholy task of attending sick and dying friends.—Our town has a mournful appearance at present; a fever prevails here that seems equally fatal with that experienced in Philadelphia. There will be buried to day, ten whites and two blacks—it has not the appearance of being infectious.

On Saturday last, the Superior Court of this district rose. During the Term, James Webb, was tried for, and convicted of passing counter eited bills of the currency of this state.—Sentence of death was passed on him, and he was ordered for execution on the 28th inst.

This Gazette makes its appearance a few days sooner than usual, that the desire of our subscribers to read the President's address may no longer remain ungratified.
