The Necessity of issuing Commissions of Oyer and Terminer was indispenfible; the Occasion, fo jully described in your Excellency's Speech, called loudly for that Protection; which the Emplify Constitution teaches every dutiful Subject to look up for and expect from the King, the Fountain and Distributer of Justice to all. And permit us, Sir, to add, that when we cease to owe Allegiance to our Sovereign, then, and not till then, thall we prefume to question the Legality of his Commissions to hold Courts of Oyer and Terminer in this Province.

We will pay all due Attention to the other Matters recommended to us by your Excellency; and, laving afide all ufeless Professions, endeavour to pursue

the true Interest of our Country.
