Board of Aldermen.

The Board of Aldermen met in regular monthly session last night. An amendment to the list of appropriations made at the meeting on the 17th of April, was adopted, striking out the appropriation of \$600 for the services of a special detective.

Appropriations made by the Board of Audit and Finance, were read, when Alderman Fishblate protested against the increase of salary to the Clerk of the Board of Audit and Finance.

A committee report was made, that a grade was now being established of Third street, from Market to Castle.

The matter of the piazza of the Dawson bank building was referred back to the committee to report plan and specifications for changing the entrance to said building.

In the matter of a Fifth Ward engine house, the committee reported that there is no house that could be furnished, as the city has no title to the property.

Further time was granted the committee on Fire Department in the matter of the petition of the Little Columbia Fire Engine Columbia. Also, to the Sanitary committee in the matter of removing the city pound. Also, to the Market committee concerning the petition for a Third ward market house.

Also, to the Finance committee concerning the claim of Geo. Harris & Co.

Aldermen Fishblate, Bear and Boney were appointed a committee to confer with the Board of Navigation, with reference to opening the dock at the foot of Chestnut street.

Mr. E. A. Orrell was elected clerk of the market.

Petition of the Wilmington Light Infantry Company for the use of the city hall for a festival, free of charge, was granted.

The chairman of the Board of County Commissioners appeared before the Board and stated that the assessors for the county would start out on their duties to-day and requesting the city to furnish vehicles for their accommodation. The matter was referred to the Mayor with power to act.

Aldermen Boney, DeKosset and Bear were appointed a committee on rates of wharfage.

A contract for building carts and wagons was awarded to R. P. McDougald, and for harness to J. H. Mallard. Several petitions, for various purposes, were received and referred to appropriate committees.

On motion, the Board adjourned.

County Commissioners.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular monthly session; present, H. A. Bagg, Esq., Chairman, and Commissioners Worth, Moore, Montgomery and Pearce.

The Treasurer submitted his report for the month of April, as follows: General fund, showing balance on hand \$17,731.43

Educational fund, showing balance on hand 13,182.86

And exhibited two coupons of the denomination of \$15 each, and five coupons of \$3 each, which said coupons were destroyed in presence of the Board.

The Register of Deeds submitted his monthly report for April, showing fees collected by him for marriage licenses to the amount of \$19.36, and exhibited the Treasurer's receipt for the same.

The Chairman exhibited a receipt for \$15, the same being amount collected from Fender county on account of Zylphia Russell, an insane pauper.

The Chairman proceeded to administer the oath to the various assessors of the county, who, in obedience to notification, were present for the purpose.

The petition of L. R. Mason and others, for a public road in Harnett Township, was postponed for further action.
