

That at general meetings held for the purpose of Electing Directors for the principal Bank, no election with less than a Majority of the whole number of Votes of the stock holders in person or by proxy, shall be legal nd binding on this Corporation, until after the expiration of nine days from the first day of the meeting so held, during which nine days it shall be the duty of the Directors holding said election to adjourn it from day to day unless a Majority of votes shall sooner appear. 3d. 




