The German Reichstag.

Berlin, Feb. 12.—The German Reichstag to day was opened by Emperor Wilham in person. In his speech from the throne he said he thanked the members for assisting in the suppression of the So calist agitation, and hoped they would continue to support the government as far as was necessary for the cure of the socialist evil He announced the abolition of article 5 of the treaty of Prague, and referred with pleasure to the friendly rela tions with Austria and the results of the Berlin congress. He declared that the re lations between Germany and all other ow rs are satisfactory, and that she would continue to use her influence in behalf of European peace.

Berlin, Feb. 12 .- At the opening of the Reichstag the Emperor referred to the plague in Russia and said the latest reports justify the hope that energetic measares on the part of the Russian government will shortly suppress the epidemic, when traffic on the frontier will be restored on that neighborly footing which befits triendly countries.

The Virginia Election ases.

RICHMOND, VA., Feb. 12.-In the U. S. Circuit Court to day the case of Adol phus Gilman, tried for violation of the lection laws in forcibly ejecting a Deputy S. Marshal from the polling room in the Fifth Ward of Petersburg, was continued from yesterday. Judge Hughes ruled to the effect that Deputy Marshals of election have no right in such room during the progress of voting, unless their presence is needed to quell actual disturb ance, or if the supervisor be in actual need protection, or if fraud be attempted. The evidence not being of the character to sus ain such charge, the District Attorney entered a nolle prosequi and the prisoner was discharged. The evidence in the case of Alexander Vaughan, judge of election in Petersburg, charged with "ballot-box stuffing," was heard and the case continued until to morrow. The cases of Parham and Oliver, judges of election in the same city, were continued till next term of the

CINCINNATI, Feb. 12.-A dispatch from Louisville says a mob of two hundred men rode into Campbellsville, Ky., on Saturday, in search of J. R Robinson, who had been appointed receiver to collect a railroad tax from Taylor county. in satisfaction of a udgment of the United States Circuit Court at Louisville. The search was fruitless. Robinson, it is stated, has resigned the receivership.


