Certain members of the Senate waded the greater part of two days last week in putting themselves on record as the veriest set of demagogues that ever disgraced a deliberative body in North Carolina. We allude to their action in regard to the bill forbidding the issuing of passes by railroad companies. As the Senate had killed the bill to establish the rail road commission, which the people demanded, and as it might be alleged that this action was influenced by the passes issued to them by the railroad companies, the senators thought that the best way of clearing themselves of such a suspicion was to forbid the further issue of passes. But they did not like to deprive themselves of railroad passes without making others keep them company (for "miserly loves company") and so the bill also forbids the granting of any railroad pass to any judge, solicitor, or other State officer. An amendment to the bill was adopted making it an indictable offence for any man to accept a free pass. Another amendment was adopted forbidding the issue of a pass to editors, although the introducer of the amendment stated that he introduced it merely as a joke. Another amendment was adopted that all members of this Legislature who have used such passes shall render them up to the President of the Senate and pay over to the railroad companies the amount of travelling they have done on them this session. Of course this was done to prove the sincerity of their action in passing the bill. The bill with all the amendments passed its second and third readings by large majorities, but of course it will not pass the House and become a law, and the knowledge of this fact no doubt caused many senators to vote for it. It was fully characterized by Senator Evans as a "bungling farce." As to forbidding the issue of railroad passes to editors, of course that is the purest bungling. In the first place these passers are not co-editors nor a "valuable co-operation" (lawyers call it) among paid for advertising the schedules and other notices of the railroad companies; and even if they were given without a consideration no Legislature can constitutionally pass a law to forbid it.

Consequently adjourned at 12 o'clock on last Sunday, and the country is to be congratulated thereon, for we regard it as the most fortunate event that has occurred in a long time. This Congress has brought us disgrace not only upon the political party that controlled it, but also upon the nation whose highest legislature it was, and at the late election the people condemned it in the strongest manner. There probably has never before been a Congress in which so few of its members have been re-elected. In both branches hardly Congress disgraced itself. The Senate consumed at the speaker — several weeks after week in a sordid, dirty office, resulting in the ever execrable "deadlock" as it was called. Week after week the body, a legislative body in the world, the dignified Senate of the United States, was wrestling with the momentous question as to who should be its doorkeeper! It really seems incredible and yet 'tis true, and 'tis "the truth." This Senate will be memorable because of the treachery of one of its members, Mahone of Virginia, who thereby gave the control of the "key" to the republicans. It is a remarkable because of the number of its presiding officers, of whom there were four — Arthur, Bayard, Davis and Edmunds.

The House disgraced itself at the outset by electing Kellum its Speaker, and having as its leader such a man as "Second" Robeson. But the greatest outrage perpetrated by the House was its action in deciding the contested election cases. On last Saturday, the very last day of its session, the House voted to seat Cook, of Iowa, in the place of Cutts, and finally adjourned without any decision in the case of Lee against Richardson. This inexplicably delay in the decision of contested election cases cannot be too severely denounced. The closing hours of the House were very disorderly. The members were in session all of Saturday night, and acted in a manner not calculated to enhance their dignity. They amused themselves by throwing paper balls at the heads of those who were asleep in their seats, and laughing and joking like tipplers in a bar-room.

A tariff and revenue bill was finally passed that is a sham and a fraud. While it will reduce the revenues of the government about \$60,000,000, yet it is no substantial relief to the

great body of the tax payers. The whole history of the tariff and tax legislation, extending over two years, shows the total incapacity of the republican party to deal with such questions, and their utter unwillingness to afford the necessary relief from an unjust and oppressive system of taxation.

The Legislature did not adjourn on last Monday, as was expected, but will probably adjourn tomorrow. Since last Saturday the members have served their country without any pay except the proud satisfaction of showing their patriotic and unselfish devotion to duty. But as this does not pay board bills it can't last long, nor should the people expect their legislators to serve without proper compensation. The very men who waste the time of our Legislatures in the early days of the session, are the first to leave when they cease to draw per diem, and those who work industriously are the ones who remain until the end. We are gratified to know that all the members from Chatham have remained at their post of duty, but that is not surprising to those who know them.

We hope to be able next week to inform our readers somewhat of the nature of the new laws enacted by this Legislature, but at present we hardly know what bills have passed or their character. The bill to make a change in the organization of the Board of Agriculture has passed the House with some amendments to the bill as passed by the Senate. As we understand it, the bill provides for the election of one commissioner from each Congress and district and also retains the Governor, the President of the State Agricultural Society, and the President of the University, and appropriates \$500 a year to the Colored Industrial Fund. The House has passed by a vote of 81 to 21, a bill to pay \$5 a year to every disabled soldier of the State who served in the Confederate army. A speech in favor of it was made by Mr. Hayes of Robeson, who was a soldier in the Union army. The House has passed a railroad commission bill similar to that which was introduced into the Senate and failed to pass that body. The bill to redistrict the State (the same referred to last week) has passed both houses and has become a law. The bill to extend relief to the owners of the Western North Carolina railroad has passed. The House has passed a bill to prohibit fishing on Sunday under a penalty of one hundred dollars. The following additional trustees of the University have been elected: Dr. D. L. Russell, Dr. B. Strickland, W. H. Burroughs, W. W. Long, L. R. Page, T. M. H. Jr., J. H. Moore, and T. J. Jarvis, one-half of them being members of the Legislature.

## Our Raleigh Letter.

Raleigh, N. C., March 6, 1883.  
Dear Sir:—The Legislature is still in session and will probably remain to the end of the week. The demands are remaining at their post, but nothing was expected. Every now and then a small assembly in the senate room, although they are on the quiet side. The entire Chatham delegation is still unchanged, and it works. It is a matter of some interest to see how many bills will be passed in a day now. But little speed making is indulged in. The house today passed a railroad commission bill somewhat similar to the one reported by the majority of the committee to the senate and which was killed in the senate. If the bill becomes a law it is expected to have a full attendance of the Legislature the next day, as the tenth of the members are supposed to be candidates for the position.

The Legislature today elected trustees of the University. Seven additional trustees were elected to be chosen of persons living near by and who would probably attend meetings. It is rather remarkable that Clarendon, the nearest county to the University, was not honored by an appointment, while the names of two or three prominent statesmen were suggested. Of the additional members five of the seven live over one hundred miles from Chapel Hill.

The Legislature has elected the negroes. Quite an excitement was caused when the Senator from Edgecombe, who is a negro, explained his vote and voted against the nomination of the committee because three negroes were appointed in his county. It is useless to say that most of the democrats immediately changed their votes and scratched the Edgecombe negroes.

It is generally admitted that this has been the handiwork of the Legis. lature since the war. The senate and house number of bills have each exceeded one thousand. Many a page of foolishness has been wasted and needlessly written. The democratic cause has decided not to materially amend the election law, as was suggested in our last night's column.

## The Work of Congress.

The Forty-seventh Congress, which came to an end yesterday at noon, will not fib a very creditable page in the Congressional history. It did little or nothing that it ought to have and it did a number of things that it did not have done. The single unquestionably important and landmark law passed in the whole course of two years was the civil service Reform bill, which owes its being as a law to democratic Senator Pendleton, and was adopted by the unwilling republicans, good liberals among them, only because public opinion demanded it.

When this Congress met in December, 1881, the republicans found themselves for the first time in many years confronted with purely business questions. President Arthur extricated the Southern questions by his Message, in which for the first time in many years there was not a word about "the South." His first Message, like his second, was mainly composed of a series of recommendations and suggestions relating to the finances, the currency of the civil service. To these the republicans paid the least attention, having elected us Speaker under the leadership of Mr. Robinson and vice-chairman of Pensions and Invalids, and was adopted by the most ignorant and least capable person who has occupied the Speaker's chair since the beginning of the government.
