Our Washington Letter.

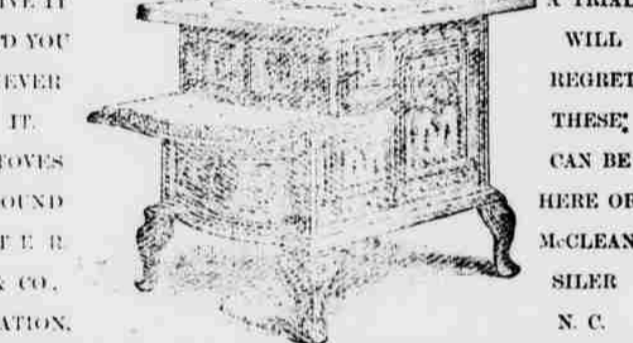
From our Regular Correspondent, Washington, D. C., Oct. 25, '84.
