The Methodist Conference which met in New Bern last week was attended by a large number of preachers and lay delegates, all of whom were most pleasantly entertained by the hospitable citizens of that good old town. Bishop Granberry presided, and greatly endeared himself to all who met him. The reports from the several churches were of a very encouraging character, and showed what a great and good work is being done by our Methodist brethren in this State. A lengthy and animated debate took place upon a motion to appoint a committee of seven to write a pastoral address to the members of the churches in the Conference. The motion was at first defeated, but was afterwards reconsidered and adopted. The next session of the Conference will be held at Greensboro.

One of the first things which our Legislature ought to do, when it meets next month, is to seat Mr. Green, the republican candidate for the House in Wake county who was duly elected, but, by a mistake of the poll-holders at the voting place, was deprived of his certificate of election. In filling up the returns from a republican ward in Raleigh the wrong initials of Mr. Green's name were inserted by mistake, and that error could not be corrected by the board of county canvassers, who must give a certificate of election upon the face of the returns. The House, however, has the power to correct this error and to give Mr. Green his seat, and we hope that this will be promptly done.

Finally when a seat in Congress or the Legislature is contested nearly the entire session is consumed before any decision is rendered, and both men are paid for all that time. This is wrong, and the democratic party in our next Legislature will have an opportunity of setting a good example in this matter and correcting so great a wrong.

Just Thomas Settle died very suddenly at Greensboro on last Saturday from a neuralgic affection of the heart. He was well known to many of our readers as the Solicitor of this Judicial district for several years. For the past twelve years he had been Judge of the United States District Court in Florida, although he retained his residence at Greensboro, in this State. President Cleveland will appoint some good democrat as his successor.

Judge Settle was one of the most distinguished and respectable Republicans of this State, and had been highly honored by his party. He was elected Supreme Court Judge, was Minister to Peru, was President of the republican national convention in 1872, and was the republican candidate for Governor in 1876 against Vance, and the canvass between them was the ablest ever made in this State. He was a remarkably kind, sane, and was popular with all who knew him.

Congress convened on last Monday. This is the second session of the Fiftieth Congress, which will close on the 4th of next March. A quorum was present in both branches, but nothing was done except the reading of the President's message. This document, like all of Mr. Cleveland's writings, is very able and patriotic, and, after reading it, we regret more than ever his defeat which we regard as a national calamity. We regret not being able to publish this message in full. Our readers will all endorse every word of the following extract from it:

"Our cities are the abiding places of wealth and luxury; our manufacturers yield fortunes never dreamed of by the fathers of the republic; our business men are madly straining in the race for riches and immense aggregations of capital outrun the imagination in the magnitude of their undertakings. We view with pride and satisfaction this bright picture of our country's growth and prosperity, while only a closer scrutiny develops a sombre shading. Upon more careful inspection we find the wealth and luxury of our cities mingled with poverty and wretchedness and unmeasured toil. A crowded and constantly increasing urban population suggests the impoverishment of rural sections and discontent with agricultural pursuits. The farmer's son, not satisfied with his brother's simple and laborious life, joins the eager chase for easily acquired wealth.

We discover that the fortunes realized by our manufacturers are no longer solely the reward of sturdy industry and enlightened foresight; but that they result from the discriminating favor of the government and are largely built upon undue exactions of our people. The gulf between employers and the employed is constantly widening, and classes are rapidly forming, one comprising the very rich and powerful, while in another are found the terribly poor."

The walking match that took place at New York last week was a most wonderful feat of human endurance. It was not strictly speaking a walking match, but as goes you please contest, the contestants going at any pace they wished, walking, trotting or running. It began at midnight on the 24th of November and closed at 10 o'clock last Saturday night, continuing six days. There were about fifteen contestants, and the contest took place around a large ring in Madison Square garden. The successful pedestrian was an Englishman named Littlewood, who travelled 623 miles, which beat the highest record of any preceding pedestrian contest. Ten of the contestants travelled over 525 miles, which seems almost incredible. Littlewood slept and rested only 16 hours and 26 minutes during the six days, and travelled his 623 miles in 125 hours and 24 minutes. There is hardly any other animal in the world that could have travelled such a distance in so short a time; certainly no horse could have done it.

Thousands of persons every day and night witnessed the contest with intense interest, and the gate receipts amounted to more than \$20,000, and of this sum Littlewood received as his share the sum little fortune of \$5,000. Such contests, however, ought to be prohibited by law, for they are brutal.
