This is the result, and can not be denied. True, some money has been expended in the name of the people, but it has been squandered.

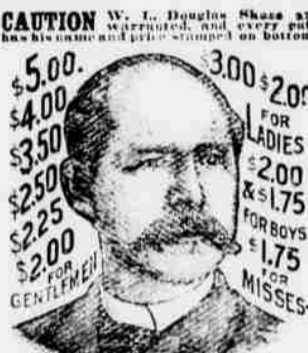
