WASHINGTON, March 17, 1893.

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Important to Cotton Planters.

WASHINGTON, March 20.—The United States Senate in April 1892 passed a resolution instructing its committee on agriculture to make an investigation with a view of ascertaining the cause of the depression in agricultural products, existing at that time.

TO THE COTTON planters of the United States: In the discharge of the duty imposed by the United States Senate on the Commissioner of Agriculture to investigate the causes of the low price of cotton and the remedy, I have made some investigations, which, though as yet incomplete, authorize me to state the following conclusions:

THE COTTON crop in the United States is being marketed at a price which is lower than it has been for many years. This is due to several causes, the most important of which are the overproduction of cotton in the United States and the competition of foreign cotton.

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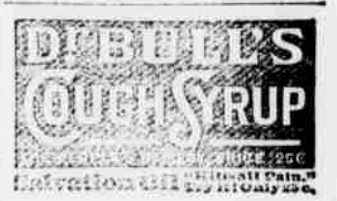
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\$1,000 for a Silver Dollar.
