DEFENDING WITH LITTLE CHICKS.
Chickens when first hatched, should not be hurried out of the sitting nest. For twenty-four hours at least from the time when the earliest commence to show themselves it is better to leave them under or with the hen mother. They need no food for from a day to a day and a half usually. When they get strong enough to venture from beneath their mother's wings it is time to move the brood.

OUTS AS FEED.
The value of outs as feed depends largely upon the cutting and curing. They should be cut before the seed is fully matured. It allowed to ripen, the stalk and leaves turn to woody fibre and the straw possesses but little nutritive value.

The outs should be bound in medium-sized bundles to help in curing out. This should be done after they have been exposed to the sun for several hours. Ten or twelve bundles are enough to put up in a stack, and three or four days are sufficient to cure them properly if the weather be favorable. They must be dry when stored away. To feed them, turn through a cutting box, add a small quantity of wheat bran and steep in ability.
