They had a misunderstanding and Hatten shot Johnson through the neck, and after Johnson was down on the ground he raised up and shot Hatten's brains out.

While out hunting with some young companions, he attempted to cross a ditch on a log. In crossing he lost his foothold, falling into the ditch and the hammer of his gun striking the head, causing death instantly.

The latter had been ransacked for money they were supposed to have. A negro at Washington City sued a theatre manager for \$19,000 damages for ejecting him, and recovered one cent.
