The company purpose beginning business as soon as the summer arrives having ordered a 100-horse-power engine, a saw mill and an improved cotton gin. In the fall will be added a great mill. The sawmill will cut the lumber for the necessary buildings and will begin to operate as early as the first of October. The mill will be located on the line of the railroad.
