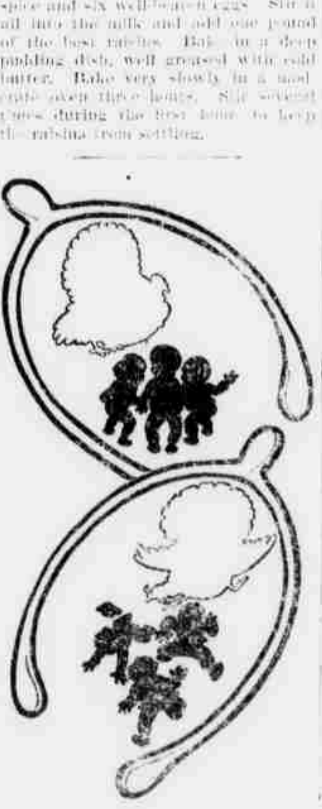
THANKSGIVING HYMN
