### JOHN M. MOREHEAD DEAD.

Charlotte, Dec. 13.—John M. Morehead, former representative in Congress and at one time Republican National Committeeman for North Carolina, died of pneumonia at his home here today. He had been ill one week. He was fifty-seven years old.

Although Mr. Morehead's condition had been pronounced critical, physicians last night stated that he was "holding his own" and expressed hope for his recovery.

Mr. Morehead was engaged in the textile business here. He represented the fifth North Carolina District in the sixty-first Congress.

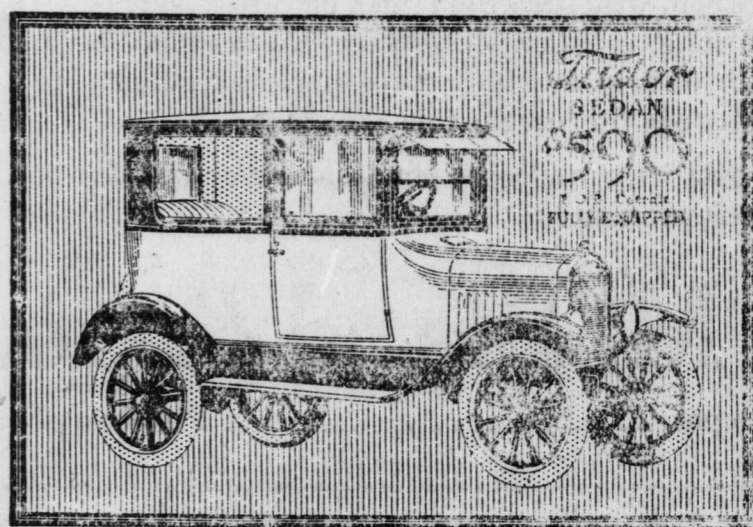
Mr. Morehead was seized with a chill on Wednesday night of last week. Physicians were called the next morning and pronounced his ailment pneumonia.

Mr. Morehead was the son of John Lindsey Morehead and Sarah Phifer Morehead. He was born in Charlotte, July 20, 1866. His grandfather was Governor John Motley Morehead, for whom he was named.

He married on April 5, 1893, Miss Mary Garrett, of Marietta, Georgia, who with three children, survive. The children are John Lindsey Morehead Garrett Morehead, and Miss Catherine Morehead. A sister, Mrs. Simmons B. Jones, also survives.

Mr. Morehead was, for a number of years, a resident of Leaksville, where his father owned interests in cotton mills. During that period, in 1908, he was nominated for Congress on the Republican ticket and elected. At the expiration of his term he declined to run again but became Chairman of the Republican State Committee.

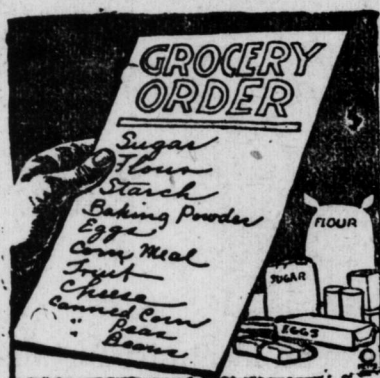

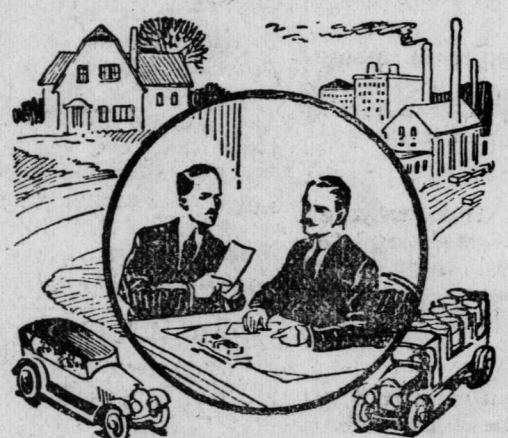
