

MAN PINNED UNDER HIS BLAZING AUTO BURNED TO DEATH

Bascom Cagle, Of Pinebluff, Meets Horrible Death On Glendon Road

GASOLINE TANK BURSTS

(The Moore County News)

Bascom Cagle, a carpenter, of Pinebluff, late Sunday afternoon, when the car in which he was riding alone overturned on the Glendon highway, pinning him under the wreckage. He literally cremated in the flames following the crash. Charred and blackened beyond recognition, he was identified only after a sister, who happened to pass the scene of the tragedy, recognized as her brother's the remains of the car, bits of clothing and the buckle of which she had seen on the highway.

Just what caused the car to overturn is a mystery, as there are no known eye witnesses to the accident. It was only after the wrecked machine had been examined that a car occupied by colored men reached the spot and through that they heard cries from beneath it. Although they tried to rescue the doomed man from the fiery inferno, they were unsuccessful in their attempts at succor on account of the intense heat. The gasoline tank had exploded and the flames, thus fed, were leaping high into the air, and it was impossible within a few minutes to even reach the car, to say nothing of lifting its weight and releasing the imprisoned man.

Onlookers Horrified

Other cars soon reached the scene and in a short while a crowd of several hundred people gathered. Although the negroes had stated that they heard someone beneath the car exclaim "all right, boys, let's go!" when they attempted to move it, there was some doubt expressed as to the being anyone beneath the machine. However, workers soon partially extinguished the flames and when the car was lifted the still sizzling carcass of a man crumpled to the ground. Onlookers stood aghast at the horrible spectacle. Both hands had been eaten off by the flames; the upraised stumps of arms indicated that the victim had attempted even in the throes of death, to shield his face from the blaze. It was a question, at first, whether the dead was a white man or negro, his body was so disfigured and mutilated, but a physician soon pronounced him to have been a white man.

As if angered at being cheated of completely consuming their victim, the flames roared in fitful gusts, long after the dead man had been rescued.

A brother-in-law of the deceased happened upon the scene as speculation to the identity of the accident victim was running riot and immediately recognized in the gruesome, blackened thing that had been a man, the remains of his kinsman, who had visited in his home a few hours previous. In fact, the deceased was returning to Pinebluff, where he lived with his aged mother, following the visit to his sister's home.

Mr. Cagle was well known in this section for an estimable man and a good citizen. Many were the regrets expressed at his tragic passing. A veteran of the World War he had served a number of enlistments in the U. S. Army. His body was interred in the cemetery at Bethlehem church on Monday in the presence of a large concourse of his friends and relatives.
