She ran out and on learning the trouble phoned for Dr. Cathell, who reached the home in a few minutes, but Mr. Ernst only lived about one-half hour.

Mr. Ernst was 45 years of age and had been manager of the C. P. & L. Co. here for four years. He was a fine business man and every one who knew him liked him. He and his family have won many friends in this community. Mr. Ernst was a native of Missouri, but he had been living in this State for about seventeen years. Before coming to Moncure he lived at Raleigh. He is survived by his wife, two

sons, Harold, Cecil and one daughter, Miss Jeannette.

Funeral services were held last Friday, Feb. 8th, at four o'clock P. M., from Edenton Street Methodist church, Raleigh, and interment was made in Oakwood cemetery there.

Then the same day, Feb. 7th, another message was received at Moncure that an A. & P. truck had run into Mr. R. P. Womble while driving his team on the highway between Moncure and Sanford and seriously hurt him. He was rushed to the hospital at Sanford.
