to foster its own destruction. These three propositions are clear, namely: (1) None seek their own destruction. (2) Militaristic wars are fought for greed, glory, conquest, or hatred. (3) Juridic wars are waged for freeing forces that are unjustly oppressed or to establish legitimate rights held under bondage. On the part of the Mexican masses, or revolutionists, the Mexican government, the second proposition dominates. With the third proposition is the rational deduction. For juridic rights our fathers fought their way to freedom and personal liberty. Human principles are everywhere bigger than governments and mandates. Human principles are innate, God given.

It is a historical fact that Spanish rule has always been factious, cruel and vindictive, and that is why McKinley swept Spain from the western hemisphere in a war most juridic and humane. The government at Washington can easily destroy or bring

to its reason the puppet government of Mexico any time it withdraws its influence and arms and ammunition. On the other hand, if our government thinks it can pacify Mexico by sponsoring and aiding its present self-constituted government, it sees things wrong side out. A large part of the Mexicans are peons, who sell their labors for a term of years at whatever price they can. Mexico belongs to Mexicans and not to foreigners and foreign corporations. And at this point I take one special example to show just how foreign influence mostly works on an oppressed people. In 1915 Americans got control of Haiti and its people, who numbered about two million souls in a small country. Every man owned his plot of ground from which he extracted a livelihood. In order to give Haitians all the blessed advantages of our "high culture and civilization," we destroyed their constitution and imposed one of our own making, impelling by special provision therein that corporations might acquire and hold lands in Haiti, and

all this was done by the moral influence of force of arms. What has been the outcome? Capitalists have evicted the natives from their holdings and they are now peons and landless tenants. Wherever this ruthless perfidy is practiced by strong powers, peoples lose their manhood, their courage, and capacity for self-government, and sink deeply into some sort of economic slavery. Mexico is rapidly hastening the same way.

Outlawry is in the Mexican government and not in the people. Were it otherwise, why has not the government been able to re-organize its forces as elements of peace and happiness when one of these revolutions end? This is the test question, and upon it the whole situation stands or falls. Any one familiar with Mexican history will affirm that Mexico is the victim of a dangerous

and unjust war, motivated by jealousy, greed, and bigotry. For, so far, it has been a war unproductive, consuming and devastating, and utterly void of any justifiable ends.

The Mexican government 18 years ago had millions as surplus in its treasury, today it is absolutely bankrupt. One thing that irritates the Mexican populace more is, foreigners—capitalists or what not—can appeal to their governments at home for protection, while the citizens of Mexico have no appeal to any one.

How long this terrible condition is to last depends upon our own government. But one thing is sure and true, our dealings with Mexico and all other Latin-American states are regarded by them as highly autocratic and arbitrary, rigidly colored with privilege, and has brought an utter lack of respect for this, our own government.
