A FAMILY OF CHAMPIONS

J. Wilson Alexander of Huntersville and his two sons Pressly and James, won distinction in crop production in 1929. Mr. Alexander produced 5,726 pounds of lint cotton on five acres and won first place in the state among Evening Class Vocational Students and State Championship among all farmers. James won first district prize among the 4-H Corn Club boys with a yield of 115 bushels of corn per acre. Pressly won first district prize and state championship among the Vocational Agricultural boys of the state by producing 411 boys of corn on three

acres. As a recognition of their outstanding results, the Chilean Nitrate of Soda Educational Bureau is giving Mr. Alexander and Pressly a trip through Florida, with the crop champions from the other southern states. They will be accompanied from this state by John Alton Brown of Weeksville and Grover W. Falls of Elizabeth City, county agent of Pasquotank county. Young Brown is state champion among the 4-H Corn Club boys, having produced 136.39 bushels on an acre.
