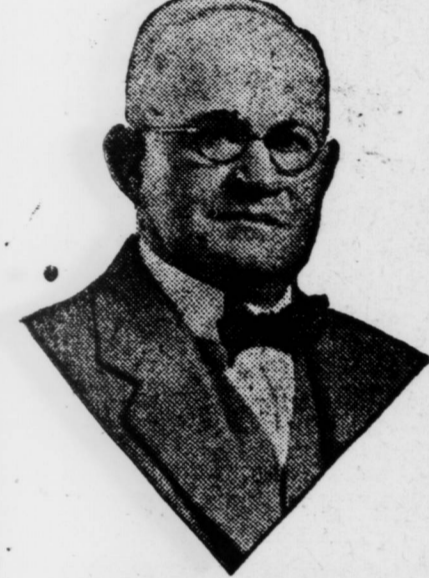

TO THE DEMOCRATS OF CHATHAM COUNTY.
