

Questions and Answers About Work of Social Security Act

Washington, Nov. 16.—Why did my employer receive today a form called "SS-4" to be filled out for the government?

This was an initial step to put the old age pension section of the security act into effect January 1.

Will I get a pension?

Yes, if you reach 65 after 1941 and if you meet the other requirements.

What other requirements?

Principally, you must work in an employment covered by the law at least one day in each of five different years beginning with 1937, and must have at least \$2,000 credited to your "wage account."

My "account?"

Your employer, if you work in business or industry, is to be given an "identification number." You soon will get an application blank for an "account number." On this account will be kept a record of your earnings, as reported periodically by the employer. The size of your monthly government check after you reach 65 will be based on this record.

What workers are not covered?

Farm and domestic help, casual laborers, ships' crews, employees of federal, state or local governments, the self-employed, and employees of railroads (who come under another pension law), and of religious, educational, charitable and scientific institutions.

Suppose I teach school or am out of work. Will I get an account?

You can apply for one and any wages you get from a covered

employment in years to come will be entered on it.

Where will the money for the pensions come from?

The wages of the 26,000,000 employees affected and the pay rolls in those shops each are to be taxed 1 per cent in 1937, and up to 3 per cent in 1949 and thereafter.

Who pays?

The boss must deduct your portion from your pay envelope, match it and turn the money over to the government monthly. The first payment is due February 28, on January wages and pay rolls.

Will I get back as much as I contribute?

More—the maximum tax is 3 per cent and the least anyone will get back is 1-2 of 1 per cent more than that.

Suppose I go on working after 65?

Then your check will be held up for every month in which you receive wages from a covered employment.

Can I stay out of the plan?

No, if you work in business or industry.

Suppose I die before reaching 65?

Your estate will be entitled to 3 1-2 per cent of the amount recorded on your wage account.

Continue Work Program

Washington.—President Roosevelt, finding the rapidly increasing gains in private re-employment insufficient to solve the relief problem, announced today that he would ask Congress to finance the federal work program until July 1, 1937. Point by point, the President checked the unemployment and re-employment situation—past, present and future—with the conclusion that industry must hire a greater number of older and unskilled workers to reduce the government's burden.
