Fussy Farm Question

Question: How can I grow by hogs under sanitary conditions?  
Answer: Consult your county agent and ask him the necessary steps. Raising hogs the sanitary way is one of the best jobs the farmer can do. Pigs raised on

clean ground and kept free of worms will grow faster, have a greater resistance to disease, require a smaller amount of feed for 100 pounds of gain, and bring more on the market. Efforts To Cut  
Parkway Funds  
Given A Setback

Washington.—Efforts to restore deep cuts in the 1941 funds for the Blue Ridge Parkway were virtually abandoned Tuesday as North Carolina House members united to prevent any further slashes in the \$1,300,000 fund recommended in the President's budget and approved by the appropriations committee, when the item comes before the House, probably today.

As consideration of the Interior Department appropriation bill, which carries the parkway item, was launched in the House Tuesday, Representative Zebulon Weaver and other members of the delegation expressed relief that the appropriations committee had not cut the fund below the budget estimates.

Pointing out that many items had been cut substantially under the budget recommendations by the committee, Weaver said that after conference with Representatives Doughton and Bulwinkle, it had been decided not to introduce an amendment for additional money. They felt, he said, that in view of the current economy drive, such a move would be fruitless.

The bill proposes that \$2,000,000 be appropriated for expenditure on the Blue Ridge and Natchez Trace parkways during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1941. Of this \$1,300,000 would be spent on the Blue Ridge Parkway. During the current fiscal year, \$4,500,000 has been available for the two parkways, with \$3,150,000 going to the Blue Ridge project. The proposed appropriation therefore represents a severe slash.

Weaver pointed out, however, that the work on the parkway will not be slowed as much as was feared at the outset, since a good share of the funds appropriated last year are as yet unexpended and will be available in the new fiscal year.
