Court Order Asked To Stem Curiosity Of Census Takers

Greenfield, Mass.—A superior court order was sought Thursday to prevent census takers from inquiring into personal incomes.

Acting on a petition of a retired army officer, Judge J. Arthur Baker directed Clarence N. Durant, census supervisor for Franklin, Hampshire and Berkshire counties, to appear in Pittsfield court Tuesday to show cause why a temporary restraining order should not be granted.

Captain B. Franklin Cross, of Williamstown, contended that the income question in the 1940 census was a violation of the Fifth Amendment to the Constitution, that it was an "unauthorized inquiry into private affairs," and that it would "deprive the complainant of personal liberty and his private property without due process of law."

vitations to come and bring their friends. Company 3420 was organized at Statesville in 1935, with 25 colored men, who were advanced a few weeks later by an advanced cadre of 25 white men from Maysville. The company remained there until September 20, 1938, when it was moved to its present location at Laurel Springs.

Camp Meadow Park, as it is now known, was first occupied in June, 1938, by a cadre of men from Dobson. Between June and December the construction of the company was completed, and on September 20, 1938, Camp NC 3420 was changed to Camp NC NP-21. The company is located on the Blue Ridge Parkway. It is the only camp, the duties of which are confined solely to the Parkway area, in North Carolina.

The principal project of the camp is landscape and development along a designated portion of the Parkway. The work is to a great extent confined to grading, planting and seeding, or sodding cuts and fills along the scenic motorway which is being built expressly for tourists. Another important job is the development of bays and vistas by selective cutting and planting.

Not all the Parkway is being planted in trees and shrubs. There are many miles of open area that the camp will reseed, lime or fertilize for pasture. The camp has, since its establishment less than two years ago, worked on approximately 15 miles of the Parkway, extending from highway 21 to highway 16. Much of the work except grading is seasonal.

There are also many other jobs which the camp does. Some of them are the construction of permanent maintenance buildings for the Parkway, the building of Parkway signs, and the assistance in surveying and the construction of a 3,000,000 gallon dam.

The company strength is now approaching 200, the maximum number of enrollees permitted to a single camp. Around 500 boys have been trained in the camp since 1938. Not only do they work on the Parkway, but they are given classroom instruction, have access to an excellent library and reading room, and are trained in a completely equipped machine shop. The food is excellent. For recreation there is a tennis court, a volleyball court and billiard tables. An archery range is being planned. The organization prepares the enrollee to meet life's problems by teaching him the proper method of dealing with life's situations. They receive \$30 a month, plus room and board.

Friday's anniversary celebration will get underway with breakfast at 7:30, inspection of rooms and cadet corps by company commander at 8 o'clock, lunch for the enrollees at 11:30, lunch served to all visitors in the open at 12 o'clock, a motor trip on the work project at 2 o'clock, and an inspection of the camp at 3 o'clock. Camp officers, besides Captain Baker, are George L. Partlow, subaltern; Howard B. Gaylord, educational supervisor; and Dr. Benjamin M. Krugman, camp physician. Under the National Park Service project superintendent, Clarence L. Fink, are Marcus Hall, foreman engineer; Romulus Church, blacksmith; Alfred Gates, mechanic; Richard Clark, senior foreman; and Glenn Richardson, Dewey Broyhill, Thomas Ishell and James Perkins, all junior foremen.

Economizers Lose Control As Labor Bill Passes House

Washington.—House economy forces lost the control they have exercised throughout this session yesterday when the chamber passed a \$1,021,639,700 labor-social security appropriation bill which was \$55,651,058 above President Roosevelt's budget estimates.

The increases were in funds for 1941 operations of two relief agencies, the civilian conservation corps and the national youth administration. CCC funds were upped \$50,000,000 above Mr. Roosevelt's \$230,000,000 budget figures, while the NYA was given \$17,450,000 more than the \$85,000,000 requested.

It was the first time this year that the House had approved a supply bill whose total was greater than recommended in the President's "bedrock" budget.

Passage of the measure also involved an implied rebuke of the national labor relations board, storm center of the congressional fight over amendment of the Wagner act, and the wage-hour division. Funds for operations of both agencies were cut below estimates committee and the House voted approval.

Efforts of economy leaders to dislodge the CCC and NYA increases were unsuccessful. On roll call votes, the chamber approved the CCC fund 204 to 170, and the NYA boost 221 to 157.
