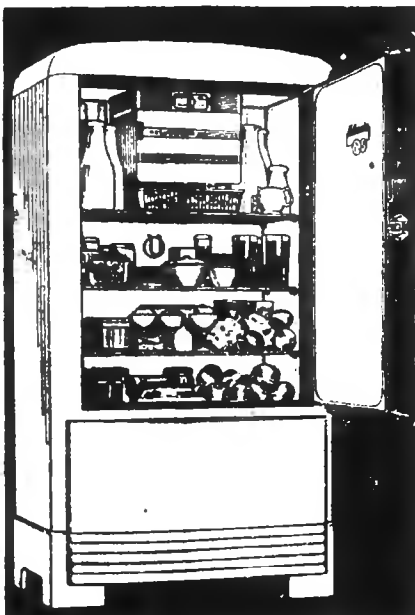

2. Revamping of the "ruthless system of taxation" that is "destroying enterprise and initiative" and adoption of a system based upon the "principle of 'ability to pay'."

3. State support of public schools and simplification of their administration.

4. A non-partisan judiciary.

5. Opposition to legalized manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors "in any part of North Carolina unless approved by the people in a state-wide referendum."

6. Non-partisan dispensation of relief funds.

7. Laws protecting the rights of labor and industry.

8. Improvement of agriculture.
