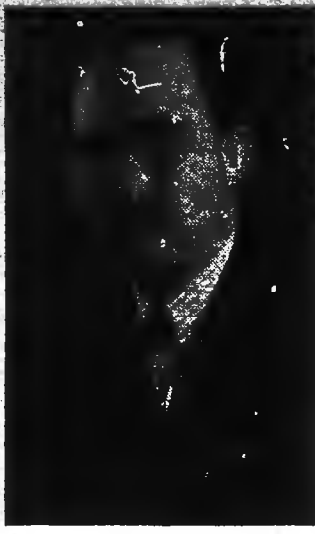


Marjorie Rambeau And Beery Teamed For Rowdy Laughs
