Historical Account Of Origin Of Town Of North Wilkesboro Given

Of His Recollection Of Town's Beginning

The Richmond and Danville Railroad Company was building the Yadkin Valley division of the Cape Fear and Yadkin Valley Railroad Company from Rural Hall to Wilkesboro under condition that the county of Wilkes issue the Railroad Company one hundred thousand dollars in county bonds when the railroad was completed to within one mile of the court house. The advanced engineers had made the survey within one mile of the court house and stopped the survey on the north side of the river. To cave the expense of building a bridge across the Yadkin River, the depot would be located on the north side

As the railroad came close to Captain Blair's residence, he moved his family to Winston-Salem for educational purposes as well as to get away from the unpleasantness while the railroad was being built, and leased his home and farm to the Railroad Company. Finley Gives Account so the lot we bought at that time was thirty-three by seventy-five and in December of 1889, my brother and I with the assistance of one of the neighbor boys began to build our store house and we had it completed and goods in it so we opened up the sixteenth of January, 1890. This was the first store building ever opened in what is now North Wilkesboro and it was located on what is now part of the site of the Forest Furniture company. We bought the groceries from L. C. Younger Grocery Company in Richmond, Virginia and they were shipped to Taylorsville and hauled over by us from there here.

While we were building, Mr. W. M. Absher, who was a county merchant at Dockery, bought a lot just across the road from us and was having a store building put up on this lot and he opened up his store in about one month or six weeks after our opening. pled by Brame Drug Company. Mr. J. S. Forester built a frame building on the corner now occupied by the Call Hotel. Mr. W. A. McLean built a frame building on the location of the present bus station. These were all used for store buildings and built by county men. The Hotel Gordon was located on the lot which was promised by Mr. A. W. Finley to J. T. and J. R. Finley, which was north of the depot. These lots were all reserved from the option to the Winston Land and Improvement Company and together with some residence lots farther back up in town. The Hotel Gordon lot extended from B Street back to C Street and is now occupied by the Bank of North Wilkesboro and Hotel Wilkes on B Street and various other buildings running back to C Street.

As stated above the town was called "Gordon" and the writer was appointed postmaster for the town of Gordon. The post office was put up in our store building. After the Winston Land and Improvement Co. got possession of their property, they decided that the name should be changed so as to have Wilkesboro in it and they finally decided to call it North Wilkesboro, the present name of the town. So the post office Gordon was discontinued and the post office was named North Wilkesboro and I was reappointed postmaster for North Wilkesboro and held this office for several years.
