

Chase Chiggers Before They Sit Down Into Skin

Chase your chiggers before they sit down into your skin. This is the advice given by the United States Public Health Service and passed on to the public by the North Carolina State Board of Health.

Fortunately, the press release points out, the chigger (red bug) in the United States has not been shown to transmit any disease.

The release goes on to say: "In the summer, and early fall when it is necessary to go into fields of tall grass or weeds, or wherever there is heavy undergrowth, the United States Public Health Service suggests the use of flowers of sulfur, applied liberally to the stockings and underclothing as a partial protection against 'chiggers.'"

ing exposed to chigger bites. It is advised to apply a thick layer of soap all over the body surface, and to allow the lather to remain on for ten minutes or longer before washing it off. Wash the body with a second lather than rinse thoroughly with clean water.

"The mites are promptly killed by kerosene or 95 per cent alcohol, but as these liquids may be irritating to some skins they should be used with caution, according to the Public Health Service.

"Contrary to popular belief, the chigger does not burrow into the skin and embed its entire body. The mite apparently feeds on the upper layer of the skin after this tissue has been dissolved by a substance which the chigger injects into the skin. It is the effect of this substance which causes the intense itching associated with the attack of this annoying mite.

"After the chigger has become engorged with food it loosens its hold and falls off."

Forty-One Die As Two Trains Crash

Every Passenger Aboard Blaming Coach Killed in Crash

Akron, Ohio.—A head-on collision with a freight train crushed a Pennsylvania Railroad gasoline-electric coach into ruins last night and carried 41 persons to flaming death.

Railroad officials said the coach, shuttling from Hudson, Ohio, to Akron, unexpectedly failed to take a sidetrack to allow the double-engine, 73-car freight train to pass.

All those killed were in the red-painted steel coach, whose gasoline tanks, bursting at the deafening impact, turned the car into a fiery trap.

All the passengers died. The engineman and conductor of the coach leaped to safety, but were severely injured. Another trainman, riding home "dead-head," also lived to tell of the tragedy. Recapitulation five hours after the collision, which occurred at 6 p. m., indicated these were the only survivors.

Bicycle Crash Fatal

Boone, July 31.—Funeral services were conducted this afternoon at Three Forks Baptist church for Ray Hollar, 13, son of Mr. and Mrs. M. C. Hollar of Boone, who was fatally injured in an automobile-bicycle collision two miles east of Boone Sunday afternoon. Simon Tate of Boone, driver of the automobile, was absolved of blame in connection with the fatality by a coroner's inquiry held yesterday afternoon. Young Hollar died late Monday in Wilkes hospital, where he was taken immediately after the crash. Concussion of the brain was given as the cause of death. Both the bicycle and the car were traveling in the same direction when the accident occurred. Hollar was in front and, in an attempt to dodge a highway sign in the road, swerved in front of the Tate car. His skull was fractured when he was thrown to the pavement. Hollar is survived by his parents, three brothers, and two sisters.

F. D. R. Bans Export Of Gas

Washington.—President Roosevelt by his power under the export control act, today barred export of aviation gasoline outside the Western Hemisphere. He permitted only one minor exception. American-owned aviation companies outside the hemisphere which need such gasoline for their operations will be permitted to obtain it.

The order followed Mr. Roosevelt's proclamation last week subjecting petroleum products and scrap metal to the export control system. The original proclamation, however, merely subjected these essential war materials to export licensing. Today's action specifically bars exports of aviation fuel outside the Western Hemisphere.

Under the order, Great Britain as well as the axis powers—Germany, Italy and Japan—are barred from access to supplies of aviation fuel in this country.

Mrs. Dillon's son-in-law, W. T. Butler, also of Roanoke, suffered cuts and bruises. Both were treated at Shenandoah Hospital here.

County Officer J. A. Steagall, of Radcliff, conducting an investigation, said that the accident was unavoidable. A tire is said to have blown out on a car driven by Mrs. Lucy McClum, of North Wilkesboro, N. C., causing the driver to lose control of the machine, it plunging into the Roanoke car, driven by Katha Blount, of Roanoke. Other persons in the automobiles escaped injury.
