Commissioners Met On Monday

All Three Members Present; Board Takes Action On Two Matters

The new Wilkes county board of commissioners, which is composed of two Republicans and one Democrat, held its second meeting at the courthouse in Wilkesboro Monday.

All three members were present. The Republicans are M. F. Absher, only incumbent and who was re-elected chairman, and Max Foster, who was appointed by Clerk of Court C. C. Hayes when C. E. Lenderman, Democrat who was elected in November, failed to qualify and resigned. V. T. Walsh, of Boomer, is the Democratic member.

The board discussed a number of county matters but took action on only two. W. C. Beshears was appointed constable for Jobs Cabin township and F. J. McDuffie, attorney, was employed to handle tax foreclosure suits. He will receive a fee of \$2.50 for each 1938 tax foreclosure tax suit.

Officers Get Two Stills, Three Men

Successful Raids Made Yesterday By Federal Agents In Wilkes County

Officers of the federal alcohol tax unit on Wednesday made two successful still raids in Wilkes county and arrested three men.

An enormous illicit outfit was destroyed in the Traphill section of the county, where Thornton Bauguess, Guy Billings and Davis Combs were arrested. In a hearing before Commissioner J. W. Dula, Bauguess and Combs were placed under bond for appearance at the May term of Federal court in Wilkesboro. Billings was transferred to Yadkinville, where he had formerly been placed under probation.

Another still was destroyed in Rock Creek township but no arrests were made.

At the big still in the Stony Ridge community of Traphill township the officers found a six horse power boiler, 2,100 gallons mash, 900 gallons spent mash, 65 gallons of liquor and equipment to handle 4,000 gallons of mash. It was one of the biggest illicit outfits ever found in the county.

Officers in the raid were R. C. Reece, C. S. Felts, R. J. Russell, F. D. Lumpkin, L. D. Fretz and William Ritzer.
