Service Head Tells How To Drive On Icy Streets, Roads

This is the time of year to point out to drivers living in cold weath er climates that for safety's sake special care should be taken on icy streets and pavements says L. K Marshall, general service manager of Pontiac Motor Division.

After driving on dry pavements and highways for six or seven months motorists frequently forget that it is wise to do everything more slowly in icy weather, says Marshall. "It takes longer to perform most driving operations in slippery weather." he says. 
