Robert E. Lee Davis Dies in Va. Hospital

Robert E. L. Davis passed away on March 21, at Riverside hospital at Newport News, Va. He had been ill for a week but his condition was not thought critical until shortly before he died when he had a heart attack which proved fatal.

Mr. Davis was born in Wilkes county on July 28, 1872. In 1891 he was married to Martha Elizabeth Church, who preceded him in death several years ago. To this union were born ten children as follows: Clarence Davis, North Wilkesboro, Tom Davis, of Millers Creek, Pvt. Lonnie Davis, of

Ahoskie, Ray Davis, of Wilkesboro, and Mrs. Fred Hamby, of Wilkesboro. He was preceded in death by two sons, Howard and Otis Davis, and two who died in infancy. He is survived by eight grandchildren.

Mr. Davis joined the church in early life. Prior to his illness he attended church and Sunday school regularly.

Funeral service was conducted Sunday at 3:30 at Reins-Sturdivant funeral chapel in this city. Dr. David M. Browning officiated. The beautiful floral tribute and the goodly number of friends present attested to the esteem in which Mr. Davis was held.

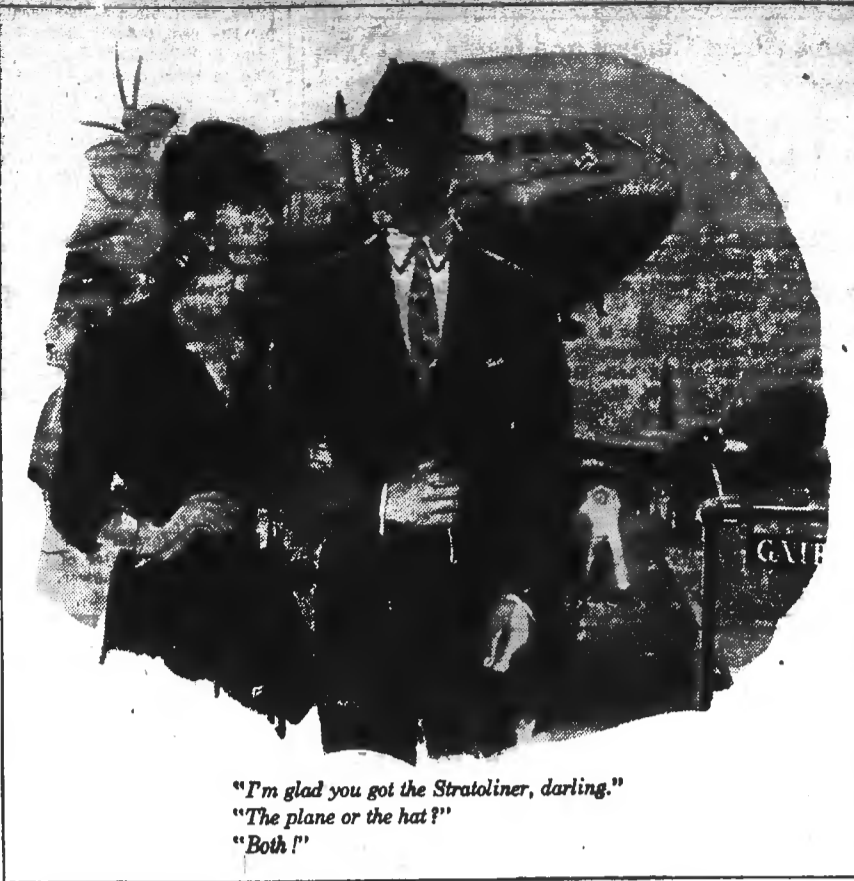

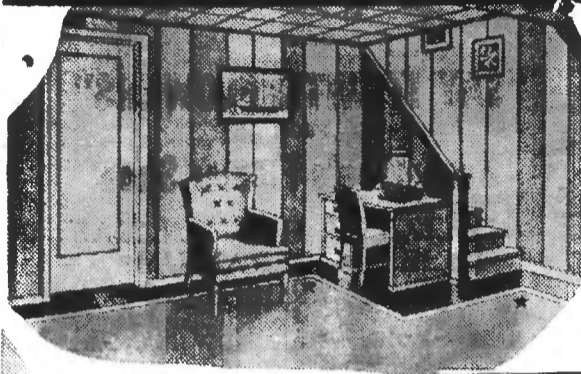
