## An Ordinance

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of North Wilkesboro, North Carolina, in regular session assembled:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate over and upon the streets or highways of the Town of North Wilkesboro, North Carolina, any motor vehicle or other conveyance equipped with radio, phonograph, or other mechanism to produce music, or having any loud-speaker attachment or other sound-magnifying device to produce sound effects, or to use or operate any loud-speaker, megaphone or other device to magnify sound upon any street or highway, or from any vehicle, building, house-top, vacant lot or elsewhere within the corporate limits of the Town of North Wilkesboro.

Section 2. Any violation of this ordinance shall subject the defendant to a Penalty of \$10.00.

Section 3. Should any part or section of this ordinance be declared invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder thereof shall not be affected thereby, but shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. That all ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.
