best judgment in obtaining a G. I. Loan so that it will be helpful rather than a hindrance in future years.

Calling attention to inflated real estate market values, the North Wilkesboro VA Contact Office warned that this condition, together with housing shortages, may cause veterans to become involved in real estate transactions which will be a burden rather than a benefit. The VA office emphasized that veterans have until ten years after the official end of the war in which to use the loan guarantee provisions of the G. I. Bill.

Ex-servicemen and women compelled to purchase real estate at this time were advised to consider carefully the following factors in their investment:

Do not permit yourself to become obligated beyond your means, and keep the security and protection of your family foremost in your mind at all times.

Do not sign any papers or forms that have not been completely filled out and make sure that you understand clearly the details presented.

Do business through well-established real estate firms in the locality in which the property is situated.

If your purchase involves new construction, check carefully on the integrity and ability of the contractor.

When you consult a lending institution relative to borrowing the funds necessary to complete your purchase, seek their advice also as to the advisability of your plans.

When an appraisal of the property is made, insist upon seeing a copy of the appraisal report and digest its contents carefully.

When you use your loan guarantee benefit, remember that the government is only lending you its credit and that, at a future date, if trouble ensues and claims are paid under terms of the guaranty, you are still liable to the government for whatever loss is sustained.

Army Driving For 40,000 Volunteers In Every Month

Plans for intensifying the Army Recruiting campaign in North Wilkesboro were announced here today by Sergeant Francis M. Darcy, commander of the U. S. Army Recruiting Station in Lenoir, N. C., who said that the nation-wide drive is now aimed at the goal of 40,000 volunteers each month.

Sergeant Darcy explained that although one million volunteers had joined the Regular Army by last October, nearly half were short-term men who signed up for periods of one year and eighteen months. Their enlistments expire during the coming year and those who leave the Army must be replaced.

In addition, Sergeant Darcy pointed out that the standards of the Regular Army are constantly being raised and that men unqualified for further military training or for Army careers are being weeded out. Our new Army of technicians requires quality as well as numbers, he said.

For these reasons, 40,000 volunteers are needed each month if the Army is to be stabilized at 1,070,000 by July 1, 1947, the strength deemed necessary to carry out effectively occupational commitments overseas and to provide for the national defense, Sergeant Darcy said.

The Recruiting campaign is being stepped up here, as well as throughout the country, at a time service in the Regular Army offers three important things basic to any good job, Sergeant Darcy explained. He listed them as high pay, security and a chance for advancement. Over and above these, he said, today's Regular Army soldier has an opportunity to obtain a higher education, to travel and to retire after twenty years on half pay, or after thirty years on three-quarters pay.
