

Legion Junior Team Here to Face Some Of Nation's Best

Junior baseball team sponsored by the Wilkes post of the American Legion will face some of the nation's outstanding junior baseball teams in regular play from June 9 to July 5.

Frank Allen, athletic officer of the Legion, here, has received the schedule for area 4, in which North Wilkesboro is pitted with Lenoir, Mooresville, Gastonia, Newton, Hickory, Lincolnton teams.

The local team of boys under 17 will open at Lenoir on June 9 and close here on July 4 against Charlotte.

It is interesting to note that in the entire area North Wilkesboro is one of only two cities without lighted athletic fields and that North Wilkesboro may play every game on the road at night, eight p. m. The home games on the local field will be at 3:30.

Thirty-five eager boys reported for the first practice Thursday afternoon. Prospects are bright for a splendid team. Other boys in the county who had not reached age 17 by January 1 this year are urged to report for future practices.

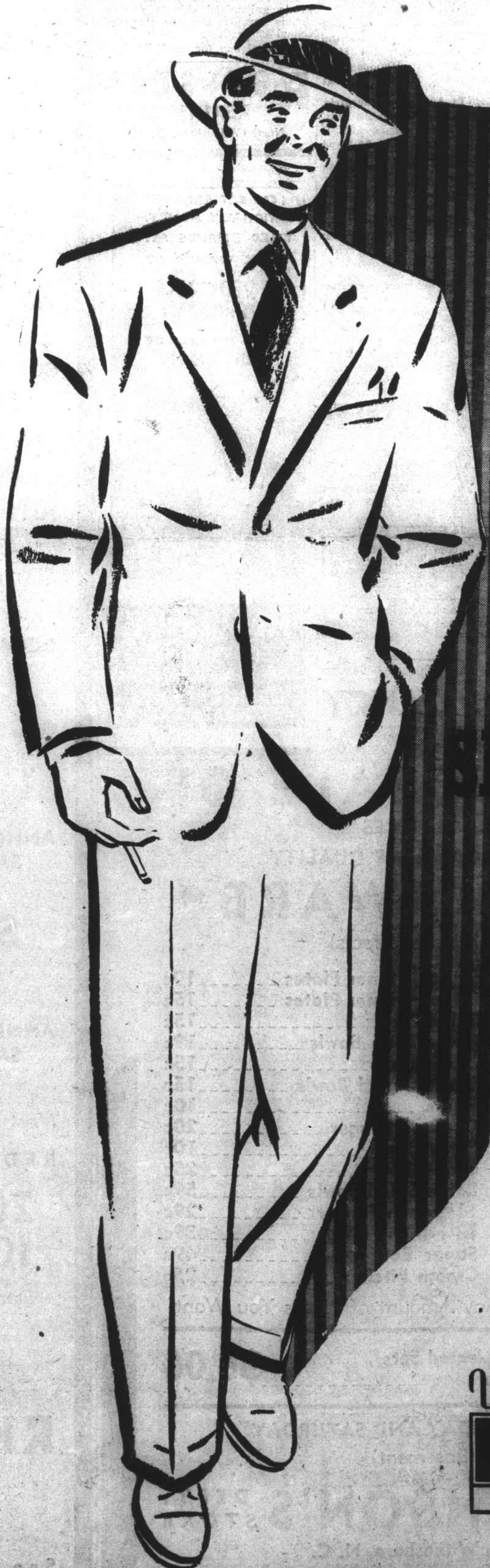

College Is Expanding Research On Turkeys

Work especially designed to develop more economical methods of turkey feeding is underway in the research program at State College, according to Prof. Roy S. Dearstyne, in charge of the college's Poultry Department.

An experiment practicing the entire confinement system of brooding will be used and will extend over the first twelve weeks of the bird's life. Prof. Dearstyne said, adding that emphasis will be given to the biggest possible use of feed ingredients produced in North Carolina.

"A great need exists here for investigational work that will result in a greater utilization of our state resources," he declared. "This is especially true in relation to feedstuffs and the by-products of certain of our agricultural industries. Many of these materials furnish suitable feed supplements if their proper place in the diet can be determined through research of this nature."
