

### Social Security - Survivors Ins.

Your Federal old-age and survivors insurance, which will provide income for your old age, also provides protection for your family in the event of your death, at any age.

If a worker dies "fully insured" under this part of the Social

Security Act, monthly insurance payments will go to:

His children until they are 18 years old—

His widow, if she has such a young child in her care—

His widow, if she is 65 or older, or when she reaches 65.

If a worker leaves no widow or child, his parents may qualify for monthly insurance payments at age 65, but only if they were dependent on him.

Lump-sum death payments are

made where there is no one eligible to claim a monthly insurance payment.

A worker is "fully insured" if he has worked and has been paid at least \$50 a quarter (under social security) for one-half the quarters after January 1, 1937, or after age 21, and before the quarter of death.

A wage earner who has worked and has been paid at least \$50 a quarter for 6 out of the last 13 quarters of his life may be "currently insured" if he is not "fully insured." In this case, monthly insurance payments will be made to a young child, or to a widow with such a child in her care, or a lump-sum payment may be made.

### Mt. Airy Breaks Locals Win Streak

North, Wilkesboro Flashers were blasting through the Blue Ridge league teams methodically, having rolled up five consecutive victories, until Monday night when they struck a snag at Mt. Airy. The Graniters took both ends of a double header, 5-3 and 4-2.

The Flashers left their hitting form at home. Sam Crissman limited the North Wilkesboro team to five hits in the opener, but one of the five was a two-run homer by Arnold Davis. Dick Long started on the mound and allowed four runs in three innings. He was relieved by Lefty Lee Bentley, who allowed one hit and one run in three innings.

In the second game the Flashers rolled up a 2-0 lead. Mt. Airy picked up one run, but in the seventh they added two more to clinch the contest and another in the eighth. In the ninth North Wilkesboro had the tying runs on base but fell short by one hit.

Worth Cutchbertson went the route for North Wilkesboro in the second game. Nixon started for Mt. Airy and was relieved by Treese midway of the contest. North Wilkesboro collected only four hits.

#### Loss To Radford 7-6

The Flashers pulled a game out of the fire and dropped it in the eighth inning Tuesday night at Radford in their first meeting with the Rockets.

Bentley started on the mound for North Wilkesboro and allowed four runs in six innings. The Flashers scored 1 in the seventh and five in the eighth to take a 6 to 4 lead. Bentley had been pulled for a pinch hitter in the seventh and in the eighth the Rockets scored three runs off Dick Long to sew up the game. Israel Ten, Puerto Rican, went the route for Radford but allowed ten hits. Pescitelli with a triple and double and Daddino with a double and single led North Wilkesboro's hitting.

The loss to Radford let the Flashers slip into a second place tie with Galax, while Wytheville went into first place by a half game with a 7 to 1 victory over Galax.
