



fied that they must have proper license under the State laws governing their respective trades. General Contractors are notified that "An Act to Regulate the Practice of General Contracting," ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina on March 10, 1925, and as subsequently amend-ed (Public Laws of 1937 ratified March 23rd, Public Laws of 1949, ratified May 23) will be observed in receiving bids and awarding general contracts.

Plumbing and Heating Contractors are notified that Public Laws of 1931, Chapter 52 as amended by Public Laws of 1983, Chapter 57, will be observed in receiving bids and awarding plumbing and heating contracts.

## Letter of Acceptance by Isaac Eller, Jr. North Wilkesboro, N. C. the second sign of the Bill May 10, 1950.

Mr. Claude Billings, Wilkesboro, N. C. Dear Claude:—

I received your letter in which you have asked me to accept your appointment as Campaign Manager in your race for the Republican Nomina-tion for Sheriff of Wilkes County.
