

Flashers Break Losing Streak By 9 to 8 Win

In a battle of extra bases and fence rattling, North Wilkesboro Flashers came from behind to down Galax 9 to 8 here last night. On a walk, two doubles, a triple and a single Galax blasted away for four runs in the third to take the lead 4 to 1 but North Wilkesboro tied the count in the third on two singles and two Galax

errors for three runs. Bowman singled and Bob Hite tripled for one run in the fourth and was tagged at the plate trying to stretch the long drive into a homer. Galax tied the count again in the fifth on two doubles and went ahead in the sixth on an error and a two-run homer over centerfield fence by Madalone. The Flashers filled the bases in the eighth on three walks and got two runs when Mercak scored from third and Davenport from second on a double play.

In the ninth Morton singled, was sacrificed by Hite and scored when Hubbard's ground smash went through Madalone at second. Wright singled Hubbard to second and Hubbard scored when Davenport hit through the box and Galax shortstop made a diving stop but couldn't field the

ball. Jerry Thornburg pitched his first game for North Wilkesboro here and struck out eight. He retired for pinch hitter Hamlin in the ninth and Hamlin finished on the mound. Wes Dare went out for Galax in the eighth and was relieved by White, who pitched the fatal ninth.

The Flashers suffered a blow Tuesday night when Wayne Davis, outfielder, received a foot injury and outfielder Don Boseo returned to his home in Joliet, Ill. Davis is expected back in the lineup soon. Pardue and Wright, catchers, held down two outfield posts last night.




