First Draft Call To Take 60 Days

Washington — Selective Service today fixed an early September deadline for delivering 20,000 draftees to the army to bolster its ground forces.

The army late yesterday issued its first draft call since January, 1949, and Major Gen. Lewis B. Hershey promised earliest possible delivery.

But he said the draft machinery is rusty and it would be "at least 60 days" before the draftees reach camp.

He added that the draft should be running smoothly again in short order and promised, if necessary, to "deliver 300,000 men within 90 days."

More Calls Likely

Officials expected the army's first call to be followed by others. It all depends on the rate of enlistments, whether reserve and national guard units are called into active service, and the way the fighting goes in Korea.

The army resorted to a draft only when it found needed strength could not be reached quickly through enlistments. The Defense Department announcement said there was "no other recourse."

In order to meet the army's first hurry-up call, Selective Service expects to screen between 120,000 and 160,000 of the 1-
