\$10 Billion, New Controls Sought

Washington — The nation moved swiftly toward partial war mobilization last night after President Truman asked Congress for a \$10,000,000,000 down payment on the struggle to halt Red aggression.

The armed services announced they will begin immediately calling up limited numbers of reservists — chiefly specialists — to active duty.

Mr. Truman also authorized the calling of National Guardsmen and free use of the draft law.

At the Pentagon there was talk of asking Congress to raise the top draft age from 25 to possibly 35.

The President called on Congress this noon to gear the United States to a virtual war footing.

He called for: Anti-inflation controls — a swift setup in war production—additional huge sums to arm non-Communist nations—and, later, a sharp boost in taxes.

Speech to the Nation
Then last night he spoke to the nation over all major radio networks and television channels and read a dramatic last-minute report on the Korean war from General Douglas MacArthur declaring:

"The issue of battle is now fully joined and will proceed along lines of action in which we will not be without choice.

"Our hold upon the southern part of Korea represents a secure base. Our casualties, despite overwhelming odds, have been relatively light.

"Our strength will continue to increase while that of the enemy will relatively decrease. His supply is insecure. He has had his great chance, but failed to exploit it. . . ."

But the President warned the nation that it must undergo some belt tightening to provide the sinews of war, and he condemned scare buying and hoarding as foolish and selfish.
