

The church was decorated with baskets of white gladioli, ferns, and candelabra holding gleaming white tapers. Pews for the families were marked with white ribbon, and in the windows large Magnolia leaves encircled white candles.

Prior to the ceremony hour Miss Wilson rendered a program of nuptial music, after which Mr. Whitner sang "At Dawning" (Cadman) "Through the Years" (Youmans), and as the benediction "O Perfect Love."
