The injured were occupants of a car driven by Curtis Odell Carter, 20, of State Road, and were en route to work at Chatham Manufacturing Company here when it collided with one driven by Ernest Thomas, Negro, of near Elkin.

None of the occupants of the Thomas car was injured. Both cars were extensively damaged. No charges have yet been made in the accident, highway patrolmen said.
