## **Wilkes County** Welfare Board

The Wilkes County Welfare Board met in regular session in the welfare office on July 25. Charles C. McNeill, secretary to the board, reported that for three consecutive months the expenditures of the department for public assistance showed a decrease over the previous month. This decrease is due to the fact that before the end of the last fiscal year the welfare board realized that at the rates effective, the county would exceed allotment for the year and as a result, the Board ordered that a systematic plan for reducing grants be inaugurated so that the department could stay within the funds alloted. Even with this reduction the county exceeded the Old Age Assistance fund. The secretary advised the board that the department is now within a few dollars of the 1950-51 allotments for both old age assistance and aid to dependent children. At the request of the welfare board the county commissioners had increased appropriation for age assistance and aid to dependent children for the fiscal year; however, state funds are not available to match the county funds and unless the governor and council of state allot additional state funds, it will probably be necessary to reduce old age assistance and aid to dependent children grants more in order to provide for new cases which will be approved from month to month.

Mr. McNeill reported to the board that the overall expenditures for the department for the month of July totaled \$4, 678.00, which was \$456.00 less than the expenditures for the






