They have a Patent Washing Machine run entirely by ateam that one hand can wash 2100 pieces within 16 hours. They make their coffee and bread by steam. It takes just 9 pounds of green coffee and 81 pounds of sugar and 3 gallous of milk to make coffee for all the inmates of the institution and it is made and already prepared and awactened in tin boilers, with so much an allowance for each inmate. A garden also of very extensive size is tacked on to the grounds and it is already growing beamifully and is seen and alive with the choicest of Spring vegetables. Some of the patients work at times-but then as a constant thing they can't be relied on to "put up a job of work."
