Young Addington came up and said playfully, "I'm going to throw you in," touching her lightly on the shoulder—when she sprang forward with a sufficient force to slip from the hand of the young gentleman who held her. She was instantly followed by Addington, who caught her, and in the effort was prostrated; the force of the water, throwing the little girl at the same time so near the shore that the young gentleman who had her by the hand nearly caught her, but lost his balance, only saving himself by catching hold of some brush on shore. In an instant, young Addington and the little girl were swept over the falls.

Foreign Commerce of N. Carolina.

By the commercial statement it appears that for the year ending 30th June, 1848, the people of North Carolina sold only \$348,028 worth of produce of all kinds to foreign countries, while even the little new State of Florida managed to sell very near two millions of dollars worth, or six times as much as N. C. How in the world does this happen? North Carolina ought to have more foreign commerce than Florida certainly. One good fortune, however, is, we only bought from Foreign countries something over half the amount we sold, which is so much in our favor. And Florida only bought a little over \$84,000 worth.—Fay, Carolinian.

Coffee, a Disinfectant.—It may be well to remind the people, says the Boston Transcript, in these times that the odor of roasting coffee is the most powerful disinfecting agent. Take a red hot shovel, with a few kernels of coffee upon it, and it will remove entirely the most offensive odor arising from decaying animal or vegetable matter, or from any other source—a fact worth knowing where the cholera prevails.
