TRYON BOYS CLUB TO START MONDAY AFTERNOON, JUNE 22

The Tryon Boys club will start its annual summer work on Monday afternoon, June 22, at 2:30. Boys between the ages of 9 and 16 are asked to come to the Tryon school building for the opening meeting. The work of the club will take up six weeks of the summer season. All boys of the community are welcome to join and take part in building up themselves and the community. For the first week the club will hold its sessions in the afternoon and after that during the morning.

The club was given its initial start eight years ago by Dr. Geo. Farrand Taylor who actively conducted its organization for three years. Major W. A. Schilleter next had charge of the club for three more years. M. B. Caldwell who carried on the work last year will again have the leadership for this summer's session. The club has been made possible through the kindness and interest of Mrs. Anne Bosworth Greene, who felt the need of such an organization for the community during the summer months.

The keynote of the club's activities for this year will be "Service in Time of War." The individual will be given a chance to develop himself as a better citizen and to equip himself to be ready to serve his country when called upon. Physical training will take up part of the day's program with particular emphasis on hikes so that every boy will be familiar with the different trails leading to the surrounding mountains.
